Untuned Percussion Albatross

Let's work out how this 12 bar pattern works. It is very simple once you know the pattern.

Choose 3 untuned percussion instruments.

Instrument 1 will play the beat for 4 bars.

Instrument 2 will play the beat for the next 2 bars.

Instrument 1 will play again for 2 bars.

Instrument 3 will play for 1 bar

Instrument 2 for 1 bar

Instrument 1 for 2 bars

Once you have worked out the 12 bar pattern, try playing pitched notes as an accompaniment. You won't be able to use just any notes because this is a pattern. Have a look at the basic version in the music. If you can read the notes, it will be a breeze. If not, have a go with this.
